



INCLUSIVE PRESENTATION

Best Practices

Use font sizes 18-24 points or bigger on slides.
Choose common, easy-to-read fonts such as Arial and Georgia.
Keep text on slides to a minimum (6-8 lines per slide and no more than 30 words).
Write in sentence fragments, using keywords and bulleted lists.
Turn on auto captions in your presentation software, if available.
Use nonsexist language and avoid gender-biased comments.
Stay away from harsh colors and busy backgrounds.
Stick with simple animations or don't use them at all. Remember - audience members with learning disabilities, such as dyslexia, will have trouble reading moving words.
Be sensitive to your audience in your choice of language and use of acronyms, anecdotes and humor.

DEBRIEF

- 1. Gather feedback from your audience via survey, comment card or casual conversation.
- Debrief with your planning team what went well, what could be improved.
- 3. Keep notes for the next event.

COMBATTING YOUTH HOMELESSNESS

The Problem

- 1 in 10 young people ages 18-25 experience a form of homelessness over a 12 month period and 1 in 30 young people ages 13-17 experience a form of homelessness over a 12 month period.
- There are 700,000 homeless adolescents in the United States.
- Youth who are on the street or not stably housed are at particular risk of domestic human trafficking.
- Homeless Youth in New Jersey represented 8.9% of the counted homeless population with 780 persons identified.
- Roughly 40% of the total youth homeless population is LGBTQ. Compared to 7% of the general American youth population, LGBTQ youth are over-represented in the homeless population. They are 120% more likely to experience homelessness than their non-LGBTQ peers.

Why it Matters

- Homeless youth are more vulnerable to exploitation, trafficking, violence, and substance abuse.
- Lack of stable housing disrupts education, employment, and mental health during critical developmental years.
- Youth homelessness often leads to chronic adult homelessness, poverty, and ongoing health issues.
- With early intervention and support, youth can transition into stable housing, education, and employment, which breaks the cycle of homelessness.
